King County Library System Card:

There are 2 options with KCLS library cards: An “Online Library eCard” or an “All-Access Card.”

If a student does not already have the physical KCLS library card, they can quickly get an “eCard.” It activates immediately. Or they can take a few more steps to get the “All-Access Card.”

If the student already has a physical KCLS library card, then they actually already have the “All-Access Card,” which allows them to use the “eCard” resources as well.

NOTE: There are some restrictions if folks live in certain places:

-The “All-Access Card” is available to King County residents and property owners, and Seattle residents, but not Yarrow Point or Hunts Point folks. Residents of [reciprocal library communities](#) may also apply.

- The “Online Library eCard” is available to King County residents and property owners, but not Seattle, Yarrow Point, or Hunts Point folks.
